"Understanding Your Navajo Rugs"

**A free evening presentation by Laura Center
 Friday, November 5, 6pm at EVFAC**



We are delighted to welcome back Laura Center for a fascinating look at what we can all learn from "listening to" a Navajo rug. Laura will take us inside the rugs to point out the details that carry personal stories of Navajo weaving, culture, and history. She can also give a general ballpark value for a given piece and a rough idea of the cost of restoration and cleaning. If you or someone you know has a Navajo textile you would like Laura to examine and discuss, please call EVFAC at 505-747-3577 and we will put your name on a list (Laura can cover about 6 pieces). Even if you do not bring a textile, please plan to join us to learn a great deal in a short amount of time about these compelling weavings.

Laura Center, herself a weaver, is a well-known authority on Navajo rugs and Navajo rug restoration who has worked in this specialized field for over 30 years. She has served as textile judge at both Santa Fe Indian Market and Spanish market and teaches a Navajo Rug Appreciation class at Santa Fe Community College. Her next class at SFCC is November 20th.

OCTOBER

INTRODUCTION TO TAPESTRY TECHNIQUES with James Koehler - \$245/\$307; materials \$25.

This workshop is open to students with all levels of experience in weaving, including the beginner. Participants will be taught how to dress a loom and will weave a sampler to learn basic tapestry techniques. Slit, dovetail, and interlock joins with several variations will be included in the tapestry sampler. Participants will weave angles, curves, and learn techniques used in color gradation. Some design principles will be presented along with instruction in the finishing process for completed tapestries. *James is a wonderful teacher and artist whose work has received international recognition. Keep up to date with James's latest projects, including his new book, at www.jameskoehler.com.*

Saturday–Wednesday, October 9–13, 9am to 5pm.

BEGINNING WEAVING ON THE CRICKET RIGID HEDDLE LOOM with Trish Spillman - \$72/90; students supply yarn; optional materials fee for loom purchase, \$112/\$140.

Trish is continuing to offer this introduction to weaving using Schacht's small but sturdy and versatile Cricket Loom. During this evening class, which meets three times over the course of a week, Trish will lead you through the basics of preparing a warp and dressing the loom, then help you get started on a project and follow up with instructions for removing and finishing it off the loom. Bring yarns you'd like to weave with or come early and buy a small amount of yarn at EVFAC. (Feel free to bring a brown-bag dinner, too.) This class is for those new to weaving, or those who have done some weaving and want to explore the rigid heddle. *Trish Spillman is EVFAC's founder and currently serves as board president. She began her career in New York City as a fashion merchandiser at Bloomingdale's and eventually found the love of her life in weaving and in teaching others to weave. She has never met a loom she didn't like or a lemon she couldn't turn into lemonade.*

BLOCK WEAVES FOR WOOL RUGS with Connie Enzmann-Forneris – \$144/\$180, materials extra.

Pick and explore a block weave draft for a weft-faced wool rug in this fun and informative class, where the emphasis is on playing with color and design. There are many options possible for beginning-level weavers through more advanced students. See Connie's website for inspiration: www.fiberdesigns.com. For your class project, a 16-inch runner is suggested, but feel free to tackle something larger if you have the inclination. Students please note: Connie will be available the day before class, Thursday, October 21, from 1pm to 4pm, to answer questions and help you with warping and threading if necessary; she will also assign looms. Feel free to wind your warp ahead of class (EVFAC will provide specs), but you may also wait until the first morning of class. You do not need to come to EVFAC on Thursday unless you want help getting started. *Connie Enzmann-Forneris has been weaving since 1976, and her rugs are colorful, intricate, and inspirational.*

NOVEMBER

RAG WEAVING with Sandy Voss - \$144/\$180, materials extra.

Rag rug weaving is a time-honored craft that has been practiced throughout the world for eons. Delve into this noble tradition with professional rag weaver Sandy Voss in this 3-day rag-weaving extravaganza. This is a wonderful opportunity to create rugs with the help of a teacher who has a practiced eye for what makes a rag rug both aesthetically attractive *and* durable. You can expect to come home with 2 to 5 finished pieces, using weft materials of your choosing. Bring pre-cut rags (or buy them here at EVFAC) and/or fabric you'd like to use to cut up in class. While beginning-level weavers are welcome, students do need to have looms warped ahead of time (EVFAC will provide the specs for this). Note: class includes a 1-hour lunch break. *Sandy Voss is an extremely prolific and successful handweaver who has been weaving and selling rag rugs for more than 30 years.*

Tuesday–Thursday, November 2–November 4, 9:30am to 4:30pm.

WEAVING BASICS with Beatrice Maestas Sandoval - \$192/240, materials fee \$25.

Learn traditional weaving skills from a master New Mexican fiber artist. Students will create both a small Rio Grande-style piece and one in *jerga*-type twill. Take this class if you have never woven, or as a refresher course if you are rusty and would like a review. *Beatrice is an accomplished spinner, dyer, weaver, and embroiderer whose work has won many prestigious awards. She cares deeply about preserving New Mexico's fiber traditions, and her warm and encouraging teaching style has made her a favorite with many EVFAC students.*

2 weekends: Saturday & Sunday, November 6–7 & 13–14; 9:30am to 4pm.

MIX IT UP! WARP BLENDING CLASS with Trish Spillman - \$72/90. students supply materials.

This class will emphasize unusual yarns. We will each design and wind one warp approximately 4 yards long. We will learn to create a lively warp that blends unexpected colors, textures, and fiber contents, using our own "stash" of threads and/or yarn available at the Center. Students can make two scarves using different weft yarns, or explore yet other ways to experiment and "mix it up." *Trish Spillman is EVFAC's founder and currently serves as board president. She began her career in New York City as a fashion merchandiser at Bloomingdale's and eventually found the love of her life in weaving and in teaching others to weave. She has never met a loom she didn't like or a lemon she couldn't turn into lemonade.*

3 weeknight evenings from 5:30–8:30 pm: Tuesday, November 9; Thursday, November 11; and Monday, November 15.

KNIT A CLASSIC CHRISTMAS STOCKING with Liz McMaster - \$48/\$60; bring your own yarn/needles.

HO! HO! HO! Learn to knit socks on two circular needles by knitting a classic Christmas sock, either as a tree ornament or for a child to receive, filled with goodies from Santa. The method of knitting socks I like best is with 2 circular needles. This allows you to measure as you knit to assure good fit and eliminates "ladders" where the needles meet. Some knitting experience is a requirement; knowing how to turn a heel is even better, but not necessary. On Saturday we will learn how to get the stitches placed on the 2 needles and begin knitting the leg of your sock. Homework is to knit the length of the sock's leg down to the heel. On Sunday we will learn how to knit and turn the heel, and complete the gusset. EVFAC will supply list of materials to bring to class. *Liz McMaster has been knitting for more than 50 years and has taught basic and advanced knitting and shown in craft shows in Georgia, Pennsylvania and New Mexico.*

DECEMBER

MELON BASKET with Irene Smith - \$44/\$55, materials fee \$20.

Learn to make an Appalachian rib basket, including splicing, inserting ribs, and god's eye lashing. In honor of the holiday season, the instructor will include some colorful basket-making materials. Come and spend a day learning and creating, and leave with a beautiful and useful basket. *A popular teacher here at EVFAC, Irene has been making baskets for 30 years and has worked in the repair and restoration of Indian baskets.*

COLCHA EMBROIDERY with Beatrice Maestas Sandoval - \$52/\$65, materials included.

This year a stunning colcha piece by Julia Gomez won Spanish Market's best in show. Meanwhile, Española's beautiful Bond House Museum mounted its first Colcha Embroidery Biennial Exhibition. Interest in colcha embroidery is definitely on the rise! Join us at EVFAC to learn the basic colcha stitch and absorb the history of this uniquely New Mexican fiber art tradition from one of its master practitioners. Yarns for class are supplied, and you can purchase colcha yarn and for a future project at EVFAC. *Making her home in Las Vegas, NM, Beatrice is an accomplished spinner, dyer, weaver, embroiderer, and tinsmith whose work has won many prestigious awards. She is passionate about preserving New Mexico's fiber traditions, and her warm and encouraging teaching style has made her a favorite with many EVFAC students.*
